

1 For the safe usage of this device

The symbols described below are found in this instruction manual as well as on the device itself to insure its proper and safe usage and to prevent injury or damage to property. Make sure you understand the meaning of these symbols before reading the rest of this manual.

This navigation system is designed to provide maps and voice guidance for use as a reference only, and may occasionally give inaccurate or inappropriate guidance. Be sure to follow the actual traffic regulations (such as one-way roads, etc.) while driving.

Please use care in handling the manual.

Forcefully spreading or pulling on pages may result in their falling out of the binding. Use the manual carefully.

2 Safet

Safety precautions



- This device was made for vehicles equipped with a 12V

 battery. Do not use in a large truck, cold climate vehicle or any other vehicle that uses a 24V battery. Otherwise, fire may result.
- Make sure to follow the actual traffic regulations when driving even during route guidance.
 - Driving your vehicle while only following route guidance instructions may lead to traffic violations and cause accidents.
- The driver should avoid operating the system as much as possible while driving. Operating the system while driving could lead to steering errors and other unforeseen accidents. Stop the car before operating the system. Furthermore, when looking at the screen while driving, do so only for as long as is absolutely necessary. Looking at the screen will distract you from the road and may cause accidents.
- The driver should avoid adjusting the volume and performing similar operations while driving. Doing so will distract you from the road and may cause accidents.
 Park the vehicle in a safe area before operating the device.
- The driver should avoid watching the screen while driving. Paying insufficient attention to the road ahead may lead to an accident.
- The driver should not insert/eject CDs while driving. Doing so will distract you
 from the road and may cause accidents. Park the vehicle in a safe area before
 operating the device.
- You should never register geographical points or perform memory settings while driving the vehicle. Doing so will distract you from the road and may cause accidents. Park the vehicle in a safe area before operating the device.
- The driver should park the vehicle in a safe area and apply the parking brake before watching DVD or VTR mode. For safety reasons, only the sound of DVDs or the VTR will be emitted while the vehicle is in motion.
- Do not insert foreign objects into the disc slot or "Memory Stick" slot. This may cause fire or electrical shock.
- Do not disassemble or rebuild this product or the HDD. Doing so may cause an accident, fire or electrical shock.
- Do not pour water or insert foreign objects into the device. This may cause smoke emission, fire or electrical shock.
- Do not operate the product in a malfunctioning condition, for instance, when the video or the audio does not play. Doing so may cause an accident, fire or electrical shock.
- When it is necessary to replace the fuse, always use a fuse of the correct rating (number of amperes). Use of fuses with higher amperage ratings may cause a fire



- If an abnormal situation occurs, such as foreign matter entering or liquid splashing on the product, or smoke or a strange odor emitting from the unit, shut off the product immediately and consult the dealer from whom you purchased it. Continued operation may cause an accident, fire or electrical shock.
- Do not touch the antenna wire or the device itself if you hear thunder. There is a danger of electrical shock due to lightning.
- Do not place the plastic bag over your head. Otherwise, a serious injury or suffocation may occur.
- Do not stop or park the vehicle in areas where the use of this unit is prohibited.



- This device can be used when the engine switch is either at ON or ACC, however, to avoid depleting the battery, it is recommended that you operate it with the engine running.
- This product must be operated only as on-board equipment, or it may cause electrical shock or injury.
- Play the audio at a moderate volume level that permits you to hear sounds from outside the car. Driving without being able to hear outside sounds may result in an accident.
- Check the volume prior to turning the device ON. If the volume is turned up
 when turning the switch ON, a loud sound will emit which may damage your
 hearing.
- Do not insert hands or fingers into the disc slot or "Memory Stick" slot.
 Otherwise, injury may result.
- Exercise caution to avoid getting your fingers caught when closing the display or adjusting its angle. Otherwise, injury may result.
- Do not touch heated parts of the device. Otherwise, burns may result.
- For safety reasons, when moving the device have a specialist at the store of purchase reinstall it for you. Specialized techniques are necessary to uninstall or install the device.
- Do not use the device if it emits a distorted sound or other abnormality.
 Otherwise, fires may result.
- The device's liquid crystal display is equipped with a fluorescent tube. Check your local rules and regulations regarding its proper disposal.
- Using the device at extremely high or low temperatures may lead to improper operation and malfunctions. Lower your windows in order to bring down the temperature before using the device, especially during the hot summer months.
- Letting water or metal objects get into the device or exposing it to strong shocks may cause malfunctions. Exercise caution.
- Metal parts exposed to direct sunlight may become hot, causing burns.
- This device uses invisible laser light. Do not disassemble or rebuild this
 product. Contact the store of purchase in the event of any unsatisfactory
 performance. Rebuilding this product could lead to hazardous radiation
 (causing damage to eyesight), accident, fire, or electric shock.



Be aware of the following when ejecting discs or setting the display tilt position.
 For vehicles with an automatic transmission>

- When removing a disc, switch to Neutral in the event of interference when in Park and proceed. (For a column automatic transmission, perform this operation when in either Park or Neutral.)
- When setting the tilt position, choose an angle that does not interfere with operation
 of the shift lever in the "P", "R" or "N" lever positions. (If there is interference with the
 shift lever in these operating positions, do not set a tilt position.)

<For vehicles with a manual transmission>



- If the device is exposed to strong vibrations due to rough driving, the device may not be able to read the data stored on the disc, rendering normal operation impossible. Reduce the vibration level and normal operation will resume in a moment.
- Condensation may accumulate on the lens that functions to read CDs and DVDs immediately after turning the heater ON in cold temperatures. Wait about 1 hour for the condensation to evaporate and the device will operate normally. Contact the store of purchase if normal operation does not resume after several hours.
- If using this device immediately after having purchased it or after having stored it disconnected from the vehicle battery, the present location may not be accurately displayed. Wait a moment and the GPS positioning will correct the displayed position.
- This is a precision device and is therefore affected by static electricity, electrical noise and vibrations which may result in a loss of user data. Please keep a separate note of the information stored on the unit.
- Furthermore, please be aware that the warranty does not cover the following cases.
 - ① Data stored by the user in the hard disc drive is altered/lost as a result of malfunction, improper use, or fault of the unit, or, as a result of adverse effects associated with electrical noise.
 - ② Data stored by the user in the hard disc drive or map data/base program data in the hard drive is altered/lost as a result of improper use of the unit by you or a third party.
 - ③ Data stored by the user in the hard disc drive is altered/lost during malfunction/ repair.
- * Furthermore, by installing or using this device, you signify that you agree to the above terms.
- This unit is designed to be resistant to electrical noise generated by other electrical devices. However, if a device generating a high level of noise is operated in the vicinity of the unit, the screen may be distorted or static and other such problems may be caused. Should this happen, refrain from using that particular electrical device.

3 How the instruction manuals are organized



Use each instruction manual in the following order.

The AVN5495 comes with 3 instruction manuals. Use each manual separately depending on your use of the device.

Until you are completely comfortable with all of the device's basic functions:

Read the "Reference Guide".

Only basic operations and the most frequently used functions are described



When wanting to master all navigation functions:

Read the "Owner's manual/Navigation".

All navigation functions are described.



When wanting to master all audio functions:

Read the "Owner's manual/Audio".








The screens used in the instruction manuals may differ from the actual screens appearing on the device-depending on the type of database and when it was compiled. In addition, the GPS mark does not appear on the navigation screens.

4 How to use this manual

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1 Name of parts

The unit can be operated by pressing buttons on the frame of the panel (panel buttons) and by touching switches displayed on the screen (touch switches).


Panel buttons

Press the panel buttons found on either side of the screen to operate the device.




Unit can be operated by touching switches on the screen.



[About the operation of touch switches]

- Touch the switches until you hear a beep.
- Touch the switches lightly to prevent damage to the screen.
- If a switch does not respond, remove your finger and touch it again.
- Unavailable switches are shaded.
- When a function for a switch is active, the color of that switch may become brighter.







Touch these switches with your fingers.

Using a pen, pencil or other object with a hard or sharp tip to touch the screen may cause damage.



This device can be operated by remote control. You may obtain a card remote control (sold separately) at the store of purchase.

How to turn the power ON or OFF

Turning the power ON or OFF

When the engine is turned on, the DVD/audio power will automatically turn on. The navigation function's Caution Screen and/or the DVD video screen will appear. Touch lagree to switch to the Navigation screen. The power will turn OFF when the engine is turned off.

* If the engine is turned off while a DVD video is playing, the DVD video screen will re-appear when the engine is turned on again.

Select the language.

- Touch lagree for English.
- Touch Français and then I agree for French.

- Map data is recorded in the built-in hard disc, so there is no need for a map disc.
- Press NAVI if the navigation screen does not appear.
- Press PWR if the audio / DVD does not turn ON. Press PWR again to turn off the audio/DVD power.

3 How to insert a disc/"Memory Stick"

Inserting or ejecting a CD, DVD, or "Memory Stick"

When you want to listen to music, insert a CD or "Memory Stick" in to the relevant slot. When playing a DVD video, insert a DVD video disc into the relevant slot.


How to insert discs (CD/DVD) and Memory Sticks

1 Press OPEN/TILT .



- 2 Touch △ DVD/CD or △MEMORY STICK OPEN .
- The display will open showing the insert slots.


The display can also be opened/closed by pressing **OPEN/TILT** for about 1 second until you hear a beep.



- If the vehicle's automatic transmission shift lever is in the "P" position, or the manual transmission lever is in the 1, 3, 5 or (R) position, or if a bottle or other container is in the cup holder, this could interfere with the opening and closing of the display. When it is safe to do so, move the shift lever to the "N" or "Neutral" position or remove the container from the cup holder before opening or closing the display.
- Do not place objects such as cups or cans on the display when it is in the open position. This could damage the display.
- Quickly wipe away any liquid spilled on the display. Otherwise, damage may result.
- To protect the display from heat and dust, keep it closed at all times except when inserting or ejecting a disc or "Memory Stick".

■When inserting a DVD or CD

- Insert the disc into the slot.
- The display will close automatically after the disc has been inserted.



- Insert a DVD or CD by holding it label up with one finger on the center rim and another finger on the edge.
- Playback starts as soon as a DVD is inserted.
- CD or MP3 playback starts as soon as a CD is inserted.



MUSIC JUKE will automatically start recording when playback of a music CD begins. This is the default setting for this unit. To stop recording, close the display (see 4 on next page) and press REC for at least 1 second. (For details, see "MUSIC JUKE operation" on page 88.)


DVDs and CDs are inserted into the same slot. Only one type of disc can be inserted



- at any one time.
- Do not insert a map disc (DVD-ROM), as they cannot be used.
- Do not touch CLOSE or press OPEN/TILT while inserting a disc.
- Do not use an adapter when inserting 8cm CDs. Ejecting may be rendered impossible.

■When inserting a "Memory Stick"

Insert the "Memory Stick" into the slot.



- Insert the "Memory Stick" in the direction of the ▶ mark until a click is heard. Once the "Memory Stick" meets the back stopper, do not force it as it cannot be inserted any further. (Once fully inserted, the "Memory Stick" should still protrude a few millimeters.)
- Always use a "Memory Stick Duo" adapter when inserting a "Memory Stick Duo". (If a
 "Memory Stick Duo" is inserted without this adapter, it is possible that the "Memory Stick
 Duo" cannot be ejected.)
- After checking that the "Memory Stick" has been fully inserted, wait 4 seconds then touch CLOSE.
- The display will close.
- The display can also be closed by pressing
 OPEN/TILT for about 1 second until your hear a beep.







- Do not touch CLOSE or press OPEN/TILT while inserting a Memory Stick.
- Do not remove the "Memory Stick" or "MG Memory Stick" while playing back or reading data. Otherwise, data may be lost. Please be aware that we will not be held responsible for lost data.



About DVDs

DVDs labeled with the marks at right can be used with this device. Only DVD-R/RW (DVD-Recordable/ReWritable) and DVD+R/RW (DVD+Recordable/ReWritable) recorded in video mode can be played. Discs recorded in Video mode (VR) cannot be played.





- Some functions cannot be used depending on the type of DVD.
- It is possible that a DVD-R/RW (DVD-Recordable/ReWritable) or DVD+R/RW (DVD+Recordable/ReWritable) disc will not play on the unit due to special disc characteristics, scratches, dirt or deterioration caused by long storage in the vehicle. DVD-R/RW or DVD+R/RW that have not been finalized cannot be played. It is possible that discs recorded using a computer may not play on the unit depending on the environment and/or settings of the applications used.

About CDs

 Music CDs, CD-R (CD-Recordable), and CD-RW (CD-Rewritable) labeled with the marks at right can be used with this device. (For details, see









- "Before using the deck" in the "Owner's manual/Audio".)
- Do not use discs with transparent or semi-transparent portions within the recording area, or C-thru discs, since they may not be accepted and ejected properly and may not play properly.
- CD-RW may not play due to their particular properties or scratches, dirt or deterioration as a result of having been left for extended periods inside the vehicle. Also, CD-Rs and CD-RWs that haven't gone through finalized processing cannot be played on this device. It is possible that discs recorded using a computer may not play on the unit depending on the environment and/ or settings of the applications used.
- The CD-TEXT function requires commercially available CDs which support CD-TEXT. It is possible that characters in CD-R and CD-RW data may not be displayed correctly.
- CCCDs (Copy Control CDs) do not conform to official CD standards so are not supported.
- Super Audio CDs can only be played in the hybrid disc layer.
- CD-EXTRA discs can be played as audio CDs.
- Voice tracks on Mixed Mode CDs cannot be played.
 Only music tracks will be played.
- Video-CDs cannot be played.







■About the "Memory Stick"

 Memory Sticks, Memory Stick Duos, and MG (Magic Gate) Memory Sticks labeled with the marks at right can be used with this device. (For details, see "Before using the deck" in the "Owner's manual/ Audio".)

- "Memory Stick PRO" is not supported.
- Memory Sticks with a capacity of up to 128MB are supported.
- Use the dedicated device to format (initialize) "MG Memory Sticks".
 A "Memory Stick" cannot be played on this unit if it has been formatted using a device other than the dedicated device.
- Always remove the "Memory Stick" or "MG Memory Stick" when it is not in use.

 are registered trademarks of Sony Corporation.

How to eject discs (CD/DVD) and "Memory Sticks"

1 Press OPEN/TILT .



- 2 Touch DVD/CD to eject the disc.
 (The disc is automatically ejected.)
 - Touch MEMORY STICK OPEN and lightly press the "Memory Stick" (once) to eject.
- If the disc does not eject (is not released from the internal mechanism), touch CLOSE to close the display and then press and hold OPEN/TILT for at least 5 seconds.



- Touch CLOSE after ejecting.
- The display can also be closed by pressing OPEN/TILT for about 1 second until you hear a beep.



- The display can be opened even after pressing OPEN/TILT for about 1 second until you hear a beep. When the display is open, press OPEN/TILT for about 1 second until a beep is heard to close.
- Turning the engine OFF while the display is opened will emit a voice notification. Touch CLOSE or press OPEN/TILT to close the display.



- If the vehicle's automatic transmission shift lever is in the "P" position or manual transmission lever is in the 1, 3, 5 or ® position, or if a bottle or other container is in the cup holder, this could interfere with the opening and closing of the display. When it is safe to do so, move the shift lever to the "N" or "Neutral" position or remove the container from the cup holder before opening or closing the display.
- Be careful of the following when a disc is being ejected.

< Automatic transmission vehicles>

If the shift lever in the "P" position causes interference with disc ejection when it is, switch the lever to the "N" position to eject discs. (Steering column mounted shift levers allow unit operation while the lever is in either the "P" or "N" position.)

<Manual transmission vehicles>

If interference is generated when in 1st, 3rd, 5th or 🔘 gear when removing a disc, switch to Neutral and proceed.

- Do not close the display while an ejected disc or "Memory Stick" is still in the slot. Otherwise, the media or unit may be damaged.
- Do not close the display by hand. This could damage the display.
- If operating the automatic transmission shift lever or column automatic transmission interferes with the open display, refrain from using the lever until the display is returned to its original position.
- Do not place objects such as cups or cans on the display when it is in the open position. This could damage the display.
- Quickly wipe away any liquid spilled on the display. Otherwise, damage may result.
- To protect the display from heat and dust, keep it closed at all times except when inserting or ejecting a disc or "Memory Stick".

4 How to adjust the angle of the display

Setting the display to a preferred angle


The screen viewing angle can be adjusted to any of 6 stepped positions if light from outside the vehicle makes viewing difficult.

1 Press OPEN/TILT .



- Touch TILT .
- The display will tilt upwards by one step (5°).
- Every time the switch is touched the display tilts one step at a time.
- Touching the switch when the display is tilted to the 6th level (30°) will bring it back up to its original position (0°).





Press OPEN/TILT after finishing adjustment.



- The display can still be opened when it has been tilted. When closed again, it
 will return to its tilted position.
- If the display is in an adjusted angle position when the vehicle ignition is turned
 off, the display will automatically return to its original position (0°). If the ignition
 switch is then turned to ACC or ON, the display will resume the adjusted angle
 position.



- Be careful not to pinch your fingers or other objects when adjusting the angle of the display. This could cause an injury or damage to the display.
- Do not insert discs into the gap created at the top of the unit when the display is tilted. Otherwise, the media or unit may be damaged.
- Observe the following cautions when adjusting the angle of the display.

<Automatic transmission vehicles>

When setting the tilt position, choose an angle that does not interfere with operation of the shift lever in the "P", "R" or "N" lever positions. (If there is interference with the shift lever in these operating positions, do not set a tilt position.)

<Manual transmission vehicles>

When setting the tilt position, choose an angle that does not interfere with operation of the shift lever in the 1, 3, 5 or \bigcirc lever positions. (If there is interference, do not set a tilt position.)

Modes

Get to know each mode

This device has three main modes: "Navigation", "Information" and "Audio/DVD".

You can switch from any mode to any mode.

Inoperable switches are shaded and disabled while driving. Pressing inoperable switches while driving will display a message on the screen regarding prohibited operations.



When installing this device to vehicles, please be sure to connect a parking signal. If the parking signal is not connected, this device will not operate normally and may cause an accident.




Audio operation screen

About the screen display

Operate audio or DVD (select a track or chapter) when the navigation screen is displayed or the screen is turned off and this screen will appear.

The screen will disappear automatically in a moment.

1 Map operation

Checking the positioning of your vehicle

Press **NAVI** to display a map of the area in which your vehicle is located.






Vehicle mark


The present location and the heading are displayed. The mark will move automatically according to the movement of the vehicle.

Viewing the present location screen



Moving the map (one-touch scroll)

Touch the screen directly to move the map.





Cursor mark

Touch the map and the cursor mark will appear in the middle of the screen.

Viewing the scroll screen

Street name display

After moving the map, the name of the street at the cursor position will appear for about 6 seconds.



Straight line distance display


The distance in a straight line from the present location to the center of the cursor mark is shown.

Cursor mark

Hold down the cursor mark and it will change to , making scrolling faster.

Changing the map reduction scale

Touch the switch and the map reduction scale increases, making for a wider range display. Touch the switch and the map reduction scale decreases for a more detailed map display.



Every time either D or Q is touched, the scale changes one level. Touch and hold either D or Q for more than 1 second to change the scale without going through each level.



Changing the orientation of the map

The orientation of the map displayed on the screen can be switched to either north-up (the map is always oriented north) or heading-up (the map is always oriented in the direction you are heading).

Touch the orientation mark (or orientation) to switch the map orientation.




Heading-up display

Changing the map display method

The map display can be changed according to several conditions. There are three types of map display methods.



1 Touch .

2 Touch the desired display method.





The touch switches on the displayed map brighten.



Displaying various points of interest on the map

Various points of interest (landmarks) can be shown on the displayed map.

1 Touch Map view .

2 Touch Show POI icon .

- Touch the POI icon to be displayed.
- Landmarks other than these 6 types can be displayed. For details, see "POI display" in the "Owner's manual/Navigation".
- The selected POI landmark will appear.

2 How to register places

Registering your home

Register your home before using the device.

Registering your home will facilitate the setting of return routes when driving.


Press NAVI and proceed with operation after the map of the area surrounding your home appears.







Starting route guidance

Once a destination is set, the unit will automatically begin searching for possible routes. This is called a "Route search". When the route search is complete, a route to the destination is set. Playing a DVD

- ■When no DVD inserted
- Insert a DVD into the slot.
- Playback will automatically start.
- ■When a DVD is inserted
- 1 Touch DVD in SOURCE MENU.
- The SOURCE MENU can be displayed by touching the SOURCE MENU RECALL switch.





Some DVDs may not playback automatically. In this case, start playback from the disc menu stored in the DVD.

Manipulating the image

The image being played can easily be manipulated.


Adjusting the sound

You can use the EQ function to finely adjust sound and the DSP function to simulate different performance environments. The acoustic field can also be set to center around a desired position in the vehicle (POS), and the volume and balance for each speaker separately adjusted (FADER BALANCE).







Changing the guide tone used for switch operation

The beep sound made when a panel button is pressed or a touch switch is touched can be changed or turned off completely (mute).



■WIDE 1 mode

The screen is shown with a vertical to horizontal ratio of 3 to 4 and is expanded in the left and right directions. A wide screen effect can be displayed without any image loss.



■WIDE 3 mode

The screen is expanded in both the vertical and horizontal directions by the same ratio. The image is clipped slightly at the top and bottom edges.

About ESN (ECLIPSE Security Network)

This product is equipped with ESN (ECLIPSE Security Network). The ESN system renders the navigation and audio functions of this unit inoperable in the event that the battery terminal is disconnected then reconnected.

The activation conditions and cancellation procedure for the security system are described below.

■ Checking the status of the security function

When the function is activated, the security indicator flashes.



Registering a pin code for the unit and the "Memory Stick"

To cancel the ESN security function once it is set, either the pin code for the unit or a "Memory Stick" with a registered pin code is needed.

- A pin code should be 4 digits in length. The default pin code is set to "0000". It is recommended that you do not choose a pin number that might be easy to guess.
- Insert the "Memory Stick" into the slot.

Canceling the ESN Security Lock (allows the main unit to be operated)

Canceling "Memory Stick" security

"Memory Stick" security can be canceled using a "Memory Stick" with a registered pin code.


When the battery terminal has been disconnected then reconnected, the loading and opening screens are displayed followed by the SECURITY screen.

- Insert the "Memory Stick" with a registered pin code into the slot.

- 2 Touch VERIFY .
- When verification by the unit is complete, the Security Lock is canceled.





If the "Memory Stick" with a registered pin code, or data containing registration information such as the pin code, has been lost, touch HELP for at least 5 seconds. A screen appears in which you can choose whether or not to display the customer service screen.







- It is possible to insert the wrong "Memory Stick" up to 5 times before cancellation becomes impossible. If verification fails, the customer service screen is displayed.


When changing the battery

Changing the battery

When the vehicle ignition switch is turned to ON (ACC) after the battery has been changed (\oplus terminal of the battery connected), program loading starts. Do not disconnect the battery terminal while program loading is in progress.

Moreover, wait until the map screen is displayed before operating the unit or the ignition switch.

The screen will change in the order shown below.



About care and maintenance - main unit and antenna

About care and maintenance - main unit

• Use a soft cloth (silicon cloth) to remove dirt from the main unit. If the unit is very dirty, soak a cloth in diluted kitchen detergent, wring dry, then use to wipe the unit clean. Finally, wipe down with a dry cloth.



Take care when cleaning the touch panel as it is easily scratched.

Use any cloths made from artificial fibers in accordance with the relevant cautionary instructions.

Do not use volatile chemicals such as benzine or thinner.



Otherwise, the unit may be damaged or the coating may peel.

About care and maintenance for the antenna

- Do not apply paint or wax onto the GPS antenna. Otherwise, signal reception sensitivity may be diminished or signal reception may be rendered impossible.
- When removing or adjusting the GPS antenna, be careful not to pull on the cord, as it could result in a short or disconnection.
- The solar control films or heat-reflective glass found in some cars reflect electromagnetic waves, which can severely diminish signal reception sensitivity.
 Mirror-type films can also adversely affect reception sensitivity.


